



# Role of the Poll Worker

In my opinion, the Poll Worker is the first line defense in preventing voter fraud.

- A Poll Worker (Work Area 1) provides a Voter Ticket with a sequential number to every voter coming into the polling place, asks the voter to print his/her name on the ticket and instructs the voter to take the voter ticket, together with the voter's identification to Work Area 2
- Work Area 2 checks the identification of the voter

## Acceptable forms of voter ID

Address does not have to match address in Precinct

## Roster

- Drivers license or state identification issued by any state
- Identification issued by the state of Missouri or any agency of the state
- Identification issued by any U.S. agency
- Identification issued by a university, college, trade or technical school located within Missouri
- Personally known by both/bi-partisan team

Address on these documents must match address in Precinct Roster

- A recent utility bill, bank statement, government check, payroll check, voter notification card, or other government document, containing the current name and address of voter (with or without voter's signature)

## **What could go wrong here?**

**Poll worker does not understand the rules and allows a voter without proper documentation to move to next work area**

**Poll worker is told not to worry "we have always done it this way"**

- Work Area 2 checks the Precinct Roster to make sure the voter is listed and there is no reason to vote with Affidavit (see special page for voting with Affidavit)

- A Poll Worker from each party must witness the voter's signature in the Precinct Roster and initial in the proper space, records the sequence number in the Precinct Roster, and records the Ballot style number and correct voting equipment on the voter ticket.
- If a voter is not found in the Precinct Roster refer voter to Problem table.

**What could go wrong here?**

**The supplemental Precinct Roster information was not transferred into the permanent Precinct Roster. Someone voted Absentee and is allowed to vote again.**

**There is no bi-partisan team to ensure all the rules are followed, i.e. Referral to problem table due to missing/incomplete records in Precinct Roster.**

  - Address Change
  - Name change
  - Curb-side voting
  - Surrendered absentee ballot
  - Lost/Misplaced absentee ballot

- Reasons for voting with Provisional ballot
  - Voting by Provisional ballots is only allowed in federal elections
  - Voter not found in Precinct Roster, Palm Pilot and Election Board could not find a record or could not get through to Board of Election and voter insists that he is registered to vote.
  - May be given a Provisional Ballot which allows the person to vote but the vote is not cast until research by the Board of Election to determine if the ballot should be counted.
  - A completed Provisional Ballot is placed into an envelope, the tear-off receipt is given to the voter and the envelope and ballot are placed into the ballot box of the opti-scan reader. The ballot is not scanned through the Opti-Scan reader.

### **Things to watch out for**

**In the past two years and in the election with the heavier voter turnout, the statewide Voter Registration system/database was either not functioning or had software glitches. This causes heavy phone volume to the Board of Election. The staff is overwhelmed and it is difficult to resolve issues at the problem tables.**

**In a heavy turn-out election and when long lines form, voters generally get agitated and do not like to wait. And Poll Workers in many cases are overwhelmed and might overlook things or not follow proper procedures.**

**Whenever there is questionable behavior, you must raise the issue to your Supervisor or to the Roving Deputies the next time they come through your polling place. Do not be intimidated by comments like “this is the way we have always done it”. Understand the rules and stick to them. Refer to the handbook, “Missouri Election Laws”, that is available in each Polling Place. You can order this book from the Secretary of State by calling 1-800-669-8683.**

## **Electronic vs Paper Ballot**

Generally, in Missouri we have two options for voting.

### Electronic Voting Machines

A lot of stories are circulating all the time and especially right before an election about the voting machines. But let's just talk for a minute how the machines work.

When the Poll Workers set up the machines in the morning they must make sure that each terminal shows

- the correct polling place
- the correct date and time
- and a >>**PUBLIC COUNT of 0**<<

A bi-partisan team of poll workers sets up the machines and must verify correct set up before the polls open. Throughout the day one Assistant Supervisor will assist voters with the touch screen voting. The Assistant Supervisor will initiate each voter with a PEB (Personal Electronic Ballot) based on the ballot that was assigned to the voter as part of the sign-in process. If a voter needs assistance with an electronic voting machine, a bi-partisan team must be present with the voter at the electronic voting machine. Throughout the day, the goal is to keep votes evenly distributed at each individual machine. This is one measure to detect manipulation or tampering of the machines.

### **Things to watch out for**

**Each voter can check his actual selections on the ballot. At the right border of the touchscreen is a window that shows your selection, as well as a vote count.**

**Roving Deputies should check the machines as part of their visits to a polling place and ensure all voting machines are used equally. When the count reaches above 65, the Asst. Supervisor should be reminded to replace the paper tape. It usually runs out by a count of 70. Often this is not noticed until the end of the day and a manual count of the votes becomes impossible.**

## Opti-scan Voting (Voting by Paper Ballot)

With Opti-scan voting, the voter completes a paper ballot. The completed paper ballot is fed into the reader by using a Ballot Secrecy Folder. Voters should complete the ballot as instructed by completely filling in the bubble next to their choice of candidate or ballot initiative.

NOTE: The actual paper ballot handed to the voter must contain the initials of the Republican and Democrat poll worker, as well as the Location # of this particular polling place.

The Opti-scanner will display various messages throughout the day due to various conditions.

If a ballot cannot be processed it will be returned, marked “spoiled” and it will not be counted. A new ballot will be issued.

What are some of the exceptions that a voter may experience:

The machine will notify a voter when it encounters a blank ballot. The voter can **ACCEPT** or **RETURN**.

Accept means the voter’s intent is to cast a blank ballot.

Return means the voter goes back to a voting booth to complete the ballot.

**Over-voted** ballots – When more than the allowed number of selections have been marked. The voter will be prompted to Accept or Return.

Accept means the ballot will be counted. The candidates or issues choices in an over-voted race will not receive any votes.

Return means the ballot will be returned uncounted and will be spoiled. The voter is advised to go back through the work area to get a new ballot.

If the Opti-scan reader stops working, all ballots must be placed in the Provisional/Emergency bin to be read later when the Opti-scan reader is repaired.

**Roving Deputies should verify on their first visit of the day that the Ballot box on the Opti/skan reader was empty when the polls opened.**

Which method should you choose?

In a recount the loser can request a recount if the election results are close, usually the difference in the vote count must be less than 10% variance.

In a recount all ballots cast must be handcounted – Provisional votes, all Opti-scan ballots and all paper tapes from the electronic voting machines.

The paper ballots read into the Opti-scan reader in some cases were not counted due to over or under votes – voter marked more than one candidate, crossing off one candidate and marking another. In a recount these paper ballots must be reviewed to determine intent of voter. Remember the hanging chad with the big question “what was the intent of the voter”? Or you have heard the term that the election authorities “found more votes”.

Not so sure anymore if the decision of voting paper ballot is the best option.

### **Voter Suppression**

We have all seen and heard efforts of voter suppression. Right now the so-called mainstream media is doing a very good job of telling us the race is over and Obama will be the next President.

I think this is mostly done to discourage Republicans and Conservatives to stay away from the polls. But I think it is not just the media. We have our very own naysayers in the Republican ranks. Just go on Facebook for a while or read all the emails that are flooding our inboxes. It is all about doom and gloom and what would happen if we elect our Republican nominee. He is not as good as Reagan, he has done things in the past we disagree with, he should be saying this and doing that.

And you even hear voices within the conservative ranks that Romney is no better than Obama, I believe all of this talk is aimed at discouraging people from going to the polls. In addition, you hear people claim that their vote doesn't count anyway.

Well, nothing could be further from the truth. If you hear people in your circle of friends talk like that, you need to do everything you can to convince them otherwise.

Obama lost Missouri in 2008 by 3903 votes. That is a fraction of a little over 1 vote per precinct (3354) across the State. So one vote does count.

Or at a school board election in my school district. One candidate won the race by 4 votes and after the recount by 2 votes out of a total votes cast (6633).

We cannot let this happen. Anytime you hear someone in your circle of friends talking like that, they need to be disavowed of the notion that their vote does not count and at the same time we need to withstand the notion that the election is already decided. We need to re-double our efforts and go vote and make sure that everyone in our sphere of influence votes. We cannot let the election be decided by the naysayers and skeptics.

### **Fraud vs Hype**

First of all one must realize that every State has its own Election laws and each County within a state is run by County officials, elected or appointed, that make their own rules as long as they follow the laws and statutes determined by that state. So when you hear stories like all votes are counted by a Spanish company or all voting machines are programmed in Venezuela that is total hype and myth.

Some states with large overseas populations of their citizens, i.e. military have outsourced the processing/vote counting of those overseas ballots. A US software company that has done this type of work for years actually was sold to a Spanish company. It does not mean that all of our votes are counted by an overseas company. You might want to question why a state has outsourced this function, but it does not mean there is fraud involved. I don't believe Missouri has outsourced the counting of overseas ballots. I believe it would have to be approved by the Legislature.

St.Louis County is currently using DRE from ES&S. It is suggested that these machines can be accessed remotely and manipulated. This is an excerpt from a study prepared by

#### ***Cynthia Richards of "Missourians for Honest Elections (MoHE)".***

- ***The County's ES&S iVotronic DREs have been found vulnerable in several ways—all of which can be accomplished despite the Board of Elections' best security efforts. For example, in 2007 the Ohio Secretary of State conducted a study that found--among other hacking possibilities--that a voter at the polls, equipped with only a Palm Pilot and a magnet, can quickly and surreptitiously insert a virus in the iVotronic that would flip a future election. This would not be detected during the Board of Elections' pre- and post-election testing of the***

***machines—no matter how thorough--because the virus would be programmed not to begin to take effect until the opening of the polls on Election Day, and to erase itself after the election is over.***

This does not sound good and I am not sure what can be done about this. This lady had proposed this to the Missouri Legislature last year but they did not even look at it. I think we need to get this re-introduced in the Missouri Legislature and work hard to get it passed.

There is one thing that I find curious about all these stories. They are all started by Democrats. Maybe because they are still smarting about the 2000 elections, as well as 2004? Just remember, each voting machine operates independently and they do not talk to each other or are programmed from a central location.

Again, as I said earlier we can do something about this at the polls. Check the Electronic Voting Machines (DRE's) periodically to make sure they match the total number of tickets issued at the check in line and the votes are evenly distributed and also make sure the machines do not run out of paper.

This is a message that has to get to all Roving Deputies.

## Absentee Voting

In Missouri you can use Absentee Voting for the following reasons:

- Absent from your county of residence on election day  
Incapacity or confinement due to sickness or disability or caregiver of a confined or disabled person
  - Religious belief or practice
  - Employment by the Election Board (Poll workers)
  - Imprisonment (provided all other qualifications for voting are retained)
- 
- Absentee Ballots can be requested from the Election Authorities by mail. Mail requests must be received by election authority by 5:00 pm the Wednesday prior to the election (October 31, 2012).
  - Completed Absentee ballots must be received by the Election Authority by 5:00pm the day before the election (November 6, 2012).
  - Starting September 25, 2012 and provided the above exemptions apply, you may vote at the Board of Election every day during normal hours of operation and up to 5:00pm on November 6, 2012.

### Permanently Disabled

If you are permanently disabled, or a caregiver for one who is, you can apply to have your name included on a permanently disabled list.

Once your name is on the list, you will be mailed an application to vote by absentee for every election in which you are eligible to vote.

### Voting in Nursing Homes

The Election Authorities are working with Nursing Homes and volunteers to assist Nursing Home residents to complete Applications for Absentee ballots. Once the ballots are mailed/received by a Nursing Home Manager, Election Authority volunteers return and assist residents to complete their ballots. Volunteers work as bi-partisan teams of to ensure integrity of the ballots.

## What can go wrong

- Students register in their home state/county and they are encouraged to register at school. It is known that “Project Vote” has voter registration drives at Colleges and Universities. College students need to be aware that voting in two places – by Absentee Ballot and in person – is a felony punishable by jail terms between 1-5 years and fines from between \$2,500 to 10,000.
- Poll Workers who do not understand the rules and allow voter without proper documentation to move through the line to the next work area.
- There is no bi-partisan team making sure valid Voter ID is presented by the voter and the Precinct Roster is checked carefully.
- The Poll Worker is told not to worry and this is the way we have always done it. Well, if it is wrong it needs to be fixed.
- The Supplemental Precinct Roster information is not transferred to the standard Precinct Roster. If the standard Precinct Roster is not updated, someone that voted Absentee could potentially vote again.

In some elections voter turnout is heavier than other elections, i.e. the mid-term election in 2010 and the primary election this August. It is curious that in these two elections the system to verify voter eligibility was not available part of the day or all day (Mid-term 2010). This creates confusion, delays, frustration and anger to the point where people leave because they don't like the wait. I foresee this happening again in the upcoming election on November 6, 2012. Anybody working the polls needs to stay focused on the job, i.e. make sure that anybody that is eligible to vote gets to vote and nobody slips through in the confusion.

Another tactic in the northern part of city/county is to provide voters with specific information as to how to vote and furthermore people are picked up in buses and taken to the polls late...right before closing times. Again I believe this is by design to cause confusion and make poll workers pay less attention.

Below you will find poll worker information for several counties in the Greater St. Louis Area. To find similar information in your county, check with your Board of Elections or County Clerk. **Note: If enough Republicans do not volunteer, Democrats can be "Republicans" for a day.**

Yet even over these representative organs, should they become corrupt and perverted, the division into wards constituting the people, in their wards, a regularly organized power, enables them by that organization to crush, regularly and peaceably, the usurpations of their unfaithful agents, and rescues them from the dreadful necessity of doing it insurrectionally. In this way we shall be as republican as a large society can be, and secure the continuance of purity in our government by the salutary, peaceable, and regular control of the people." --Thomas Jefferson to Samuel Kercheval, 1816. ME 15:70*

*"Divide the counties into wards of such size as that every citizen can attend, when called on, and act in person. Ascribe to them the government of their wards in all things relating to themselves exclusively. - **Talk to their friends and neighbors and church groups about the issues and get them involved**
- **Walk their neighborhoods and precincts and encourage citizens to register to vote and vote in all elections**
- **Work very hard to elect constitutional conservatives in the Primary elections**
